**DELIVERY:** Minimum number of trees/shrubs per order is 200. Self pick up there is no minimum.

**RESTOCK FEE:** Restock fee is 25% plus any fees incurred. If cancellation of order or product after October 31st

**TERMS:** Payment due 30 days after shipping date.

Past due accounts are subject to 1.5% service charge on remaining balance per month.

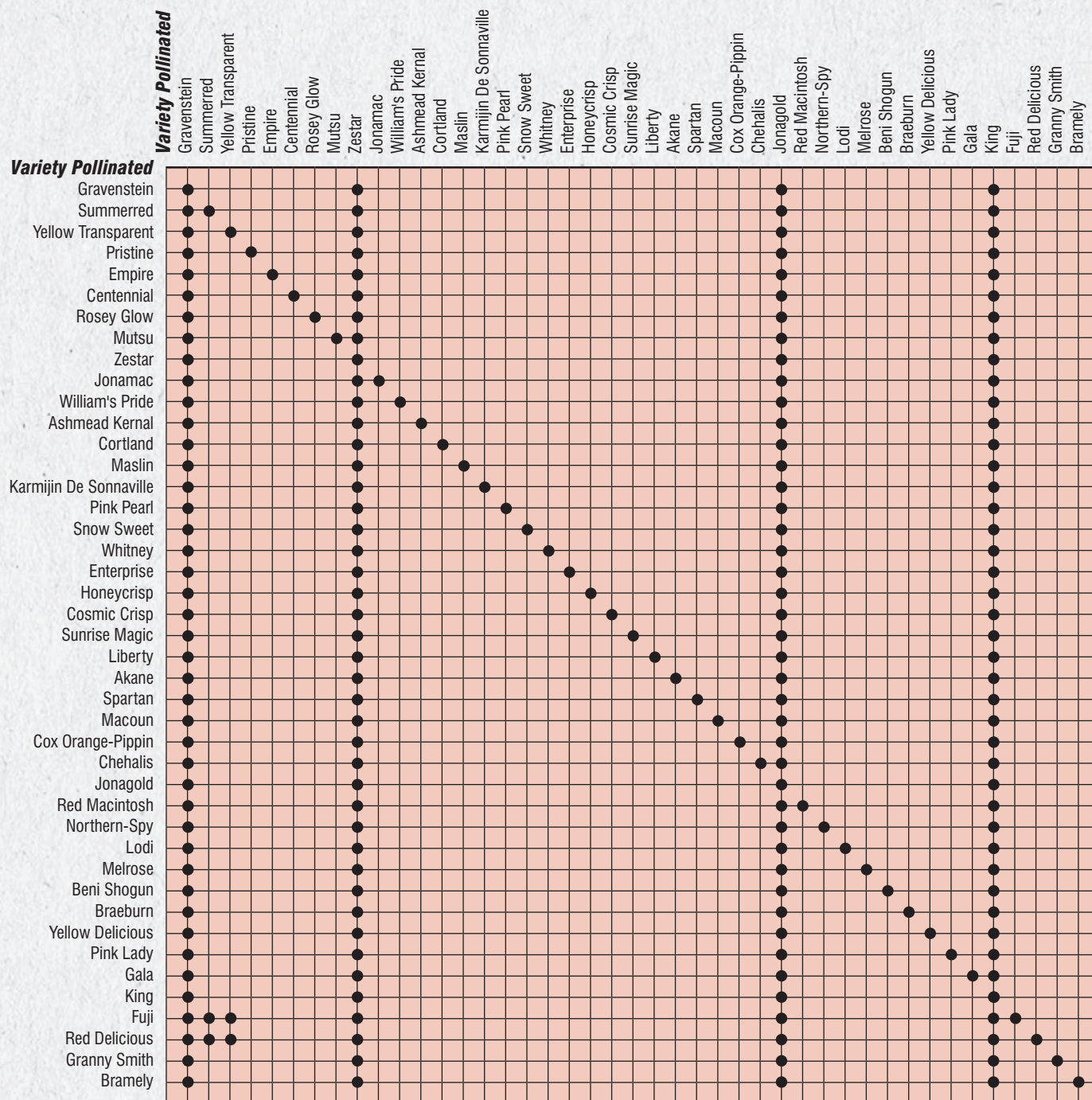
